Buttercup

In March, Daisy has been practicing our road safety skills on local walks and small trips to the library. We intend to continue our visits to the library in April. We have started to introduce Easter and Spring through different activities which will also be taken into April, with us looking for signs of Spring on our walks and discussing baby animals.

Babies have been a big focus for us, so we have been developing this area of the room with new resources to aid in our role play development. We are looking for parents to provide labelled indoor shoes. These can stay in the nursery and allow the children to be comfy and access soft play safely.

We have been starting to look out for the signs of spring by going on local walks, looking for Spring animals and all the flowers blossoming. On our walks we have been focusing on road safety, looking out for danger and following the teachers' instructions. The children have loved doing spring arts and crafts, making flowers and different things related to spring using lots of different spring pastel colours to do so.

We have also been busy making cards and biscuits to show how much we appreciate our Mummy's and Parents.

Next month we will start introducing easter and have conversations about what easter is and why we celebrate easter. We will also be focusing on learning how to identify and learn our names through pictures or writing.

Bluebell



This month in Bluebell we have been doing lots over the past few weeks. We have been taking small groups of children to Edinburgh on a local bus. This trip is ongoing for some children that are still waiting to go. We took them to the Chamber Street Museum. At the museum, we saw lots of different things and interacted with some of the exhibits, such as the land and sea animal areas. We then went to see the area with planes, cars and bikes. The children were so happy to get out and explore the different areas of the museum.

We have also been speaking to the children about emotions, how to deal with our own emotions and recognise them in others. We have created a visual emotions board where children drew faces showing different emotions.

In the coming weeks and months, we hope to make regular visits to our local library. The children really enjoy story time at nursery, so this gives us access to a larger variety of stories while also letting us connect with our local community.

We have recently welcomed all parents back into the playroom and have had lots of positive feedback from parents, carers and staff.
