Our Improvement Plan

Priority 3: to further develop the provision of loose parts.

As mentioned in the last newsletter, a priority area for us is the development of our loose parts resources, which we are working on through adding a wide variety of loose parts and heuristic items that will encourage open-ended play and stimulate the imagination.

We would look for things like corks, jar lids, pinecones, sticks, and more like that, and you can help us by looking out for posts stating what items we are looking for and putting what you can in the collection point at reception.
